GIFT DESIGNATIONS

Children's Miracle Network

Provides funds to purchase equipment and support programs needed to deliver the highest quality of care possible for children who utilize the services of Shannon.

"Our goal is to keep preemie babies close to home, and parents close to their support system, and we wouldn't be able to provide this level of care without Children's Miracle Network. The average NICU stay for babies is around 30 days; caring for a premature infant can mean lost wages, missed time with extended family or siblings, and the additional cost of travel expenses in another part of the state. When the parents can find a balance between caring for a high-needs newborn and supporting the rest of their household, we see better health outcomes in babies and families." - Paige Carter, BSN, RN, NICU Director

Gus Eckhardt Lectureship/ Trauma Symposium

Provides an annual lecture of superior medical continuing education for the medical caregivers in our region.

"The trauma services team strives to provide an agenda of current evidence-based practice, emerging trends, and interesting topics provided by trauma experts. We are passionate about offering this educational program because we are aware that by enhancing competence across multiple disciplines, trauma patients will have better outcomes. Oncology Angel Fund

Provides financial assistance to Shannon patients who meet criteria for indigency.

"We believe that no one should face cancer alone—or burdened by the weight of financial hardship. Through the Oncology Angel fund, we have been able to extend meaningful, compassionate support to patients and caregivers navigating some of the most challenging and distressing times of their lives. We are able to provide critical financial assistance to help patients and families cover essential expenses such as medications, hotel stays for travel to out-of-town treatments, utility bills, gas cards, and transportation to appointments. These may seem like simple needs, but for patients in active treatment or recovery, they are lifelines—offering stability, dignity, and peace of mind."

Employee Benevolence Fund

Provides financial assistance (on a limited basis) to Shannon Team Members who meet criteria for items such as rent, utility bills, and other similar expenditures.

We have an opportunity to have a heart for our community and it's great that we start in-house first, taking care of our own needs. It's team members helping team members."

Nurse Education Fund/Shared Governance

Provides education opportunities to all Shannon nursing staff members by bringing in speakers and/or offering scholarships to offset conference registration expenses.

"The Nurse Education Funds play a vital role in supporting both our nursing staff and the patients we serve at Shannon. These funds have provided opportunities for nurses to attend national conferences—either in person or virtually—related to their specific areas of practice. These evidence-based conferences allow nurses to gain the latest knowledge and best practices in their fields. Patient Benevolence Fund

Provides assistance for items such as medication, DME, etc. to patients at discharge for return home, at the discretion of Case Management and/or Quality Resources.

"Social determinants of health contribute to wide health disparities and inequities. The patient benevolence fund is utilized in discharge planning to address barriers that have the potential to impact recovery. These include assistance with durable medical equipment, medical supplies, medication assistance, transportation for appointments, temporary lodging, and food resources. These resources are often the glue that helps tie up a safe and appropriate discharge plan." - Karen Jansa, LCSW-CCM, Social Work Manager
